Council candidate launches Web site

Jane Miller, a candidate for the August election to the Oak Ridge City Council, has launched a Web site on her campaign at www.janemiller.org.

Miller's Web site includes her position on issues facing the city, biographical information and news articles about her work on City Council and in the community. The site also provides Miller's contact information and e-mail address for those who have questions or comments about her positions in the council race.

Appointed to City Council in October 2003, Miller replaced Jerry Kuhaida when he resigned to work on local government development in Iraq. Kuhaida, who initially filed as a candidate upon his return from Iraq, has withdrawn and endorsed Miller for the council seat.

In her position with BWXT-Y12, Miller is responsible for community and visitor relations. She has served as chair and board member of the Oak Ridge Convention and Visitors Bureau and currently serves on the Oak Ridge Leadership board of directors. For the past seven years, she has taught kindergarten Sunday school at Central Baptist Church in Oak Ridge, according to a news release.

She has lived in Oak Ridge since the age of 3. She is a Oak Ridge High School and University of Tennessee graduate, where she earned a bachelor's degree in business management. She is a graduate of the Leadership Oak Ridge Class of 1999 and East Tennessee Regional Leadership Class of 2003.

Six names will appear on the August ballot, but two candidates have withdrawn. Running are Sam Childress, Miller, Arthur Shady and Ellen Smith. Martin McBride's and Kuhaida's names will also appear, but both have withdrawn.
